Despite the recognition and discounts offered to veterans on service days, affordable housing remains a significant challenge for many postservice. DCLT is committed to changing this narrative. In a bold and forwardthinking approach, DCLT plans to unveil new 1bedroom and 2-bedroom units using shipping container

construction this year. These units will provide veterans with a stable foundation for achieving economic security.

Part of the plan includes partnering with service providers to offer supportive services tailored to the needs of veterans.

Additionally, amenities such as common areas, gardens, and shaded seating areas will be integrated into Veteran's Village, enhancing the overall living experience for residents.



Volunteers of America Chesapeake & Carolinas (VOACC) commitment is to ensure that those who served our country can live their lives with the dignity and independence they deserve.




